Methodology - Current Wave

• This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for this wave was provided by the Swedish International Development and Cooperation Agency (Sida)

Current survey wave:

- Fieldwork dates: July 31 August 12, 2012
- 2,038 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample including Capital, urban and rural areas.

Sample design

- NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design with both stratification and clustering
- Households are selected via random route sampling
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews are conducted face-to-face
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 3%

Methodology – Historical Waves

- This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for most waves was provided by Sida,
 however one wave was funded by the Eurasia Foundation and one by the British Embassy
- Historical waves:

June 2012

- Fieldwork dates: June 4 June 22, 2012
- 6,299 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample including urban and rural areas as well as additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Tbilisi, Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti and Rustavi as well as the Majoritarian districts of Saburtalo, Isani, Samgori, Nadzaladvi, Gldani, Telavi, Kobuleti, Zugdidi and Gori
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/- 2%

February 2012

- Fieldwork dates: February 22 March 5, 2012
- 3,161 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample including representative samples of Tbilisi, Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti,
 Rustavi, Telavi District 17, other urban and rural areas

September 2011

- Fieldwork dates: September 9-21, 2011
- 2,425 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample with additional representative samples in Tbilisi, Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti, Rustavi, Telavi District 17, other urban and rural areas

Methodology – Historical Waves

March 2011

- Fieldwork dates: March 4-17, 2011
- 2,893 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample, including representative samples in Tbilisi, Kutaisi, Batumi, Rustavi,
 other urban and rural areas

July 2010

- Fieldwork dates: June 24 July 5, 2012
- 2,053 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample including Including an oversample of Tbilisi


April 2010

- Fieldwork dates: April 11-26, 2010
- 2,053 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample, including an oversample of Tbilisi and representative samples in urban and rural areas
- The average margin of error for these waves is +/- 3%


Most important national issues (q1) Part 1





How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to January 2008? (q2)




Politicians in Georgia talk about... too much, the right amount or too little? (q3)










How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to January 2008? (q5)




Do you consider yourself to be employed? (q94)




Do you consider yourself to be employed? (q94 X Gender)




Do you consider yourself to be employed? (q94 X Age)

Georgian Employment at a Glance


The illustration to the right shows these groups as follows:

- includes students, homemakers, retired persons who are not interested in looking for a job, unemployed persons who are not interested in looking for a job, etc.)







In which direction is Georgia going? (q11)











Which statement do you agree with the most? (q19)




What does democracy mean to you? (q17)




To what extent do you agree or disagree that the current government is making the changes that matter to you? (q13)



To what extent do you agree or disagree that the current local government is making the changes that matter to you? (q14)




Which three reforms would be most important for Georgia/which do you expect to see achieved in the next 6 months? (q7/q8)




How do you think the coming parliamentary elections will be conducted? (q27)




What are the three biggest barriers to free and fair elections in Georgia? (q28) Part 1





Whose opinion do you think matters most, when it comes to deciding whether elections have been run well? (q29)







What is the most important issue to you that Merabishvili's plan addresses? - of the 47 % who was aware of the plan (q68)




Do you support this plan? - of the 47 % who was aware of the plan (q69)




What is the most important issue to you that Ivanishvili's plan addresses? - of the 22 % who was aware of the plan (q82)




Do you support Ivanishvili's plan? - of the 22 % who was aware of the plan (q83)




Are you aware of the establishment of the Ministry of Employment? (q71)




Do you approve or disapprove of the establishment of the Ministry of Employment? (q72)




Do you expect the work of the Ministry to improve the employment situation in Georgia? (q73)








Do you approve or disapprove of this action by the Prosecutor's Office? (q77)








Do you approve or disapprove of this legislation by the Parliament? (q79)













Do you think the response taken by the government has been adequate? (q88)





Do you personally know someone who you believe was fired from a state/public job because of their political beliefs? (q90)




Do you personally know someone who you believe was fired from a state/public job because of their political beliefs? (q90 X Settlement)




What do you expect from your majoritarian member of parliament? (q42)



When deciding who you want as your Majoritarian MP, what is important for you? (name up to three) (q43)




Comparing the performance of men and women in elected office, what do you think? (q44)




Comparing the performance of men and women in elected office, what do you think? (q44 X Gender)







Would you vote for a woman candidate in the next parliamentary elections? (q45)




Do you think 9 women members in parliament is...? (q46)





An amendment to law has been passed by parliament establishing financial incentives for parties to increase the number of women on their party lists. Do you support this amendment? (q47)






Do you approve or disapprove of Georgia's current relationship with Russia? (q53)




When do you think Georgia will be granted NATO membership? (q55)

If 2012 parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q20)




If 2012 parliamentary elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q20 X Gender)




If presidential elections were held tomorrow, would you vote? (q23)






How do you receive TV signal? (q58)






Do you watch the following TV channels on the Internet? (q59)




Do you watch coverage of Georgian politics and current events on the following channels? (q60)




Do you think that news about Georgian politics and current affairs on the following Georgian TV channels mostly reflect the interests of government, opposition or neither? (q61)




How much do you trust coverage of news and current affairs on the following TV channels? (q62)



Do you watch GPB Channel 2 which provides live coverage of Parliament and gives Free Tribune to political parties? (q63)




In the past three months have you been receiving enough information from the media about the party you support? (q64)






Where do you talk about politics? - of the 46% who talk about politics (q92)
