Methodology - Current Wave

 This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding for this wave was provided by the Swedish International Development and Cooperation Agency (Sida).

Current survey wave:

- Fieldwork dates: July 23 August 7, 2014
- 3,338 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Tbilisi, Batumi, Poti, Gori, Telavi and Mtskheta.

Sample design

- NDI and CRRC use a complex survey design with both stratification and clustering
- Households are selected via random route sampling
- Respondents are selected using a Kish table
- Randomly selected households and individuals are not substituted
- All interviews are conducted face-to-face
- The average margin of error is +/- 2.9%

Methodology – Historical Waves

- This research has been conducted over multiple waves. The funding was provided by Sida.
- Historical waves:

April 2014

- Fieldwork dates: March 26 April 18, 2014
- 3,942 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of 12 self governing cities of Tbilisi, Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti, Rustavi, Gori, Akhaltsikhe, Ozurgeti, Ambrolauri, Zugdidi, Telavi and Mtskheta.
- The average margin of error +/- 2.1%

November 2013:


- Fieldwork dates: November 13 27, 2013
- 3,915 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti and Rustavi, as well as the districts of Telavi, Gori, Akhaltsikhe, Zugdidi and Ambrolauri.
- The average margin of error is +/- 2%

September 2013


- Fieldwork dates: August 18 September 3, 2013
- 3,838 completed interviews
- A nationally representative sample of Georgian speakers including Capital, Urban, Rural, East Georgia and West Georgia areas. Also additional representative samples of the self governing cities of Kutaisi, Batumi, Poti and Rustavi, as well as the districts of Telavi, Gori, Akhaltsikhe, Zugdidi and Ambrolauri.
- The average margin of error does not exceed +/-2%




How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to October 2012? (q2)




Most important local issues. Name up to three (q4) Part 1













How do you think the situation has changed in Georgia compared to October 2012? (q5)






After the parliamentary elections of October 2012 has the number of jobs available in Georgia... (q12)




Georgian Employment at a Glance

The illustration to the right shows these groups as follows:


- 32%--Employed (full or part time)

- 32%--Non-active labour force (This includes students, homemakers, retired persons who are not interested in looking for a job.)




Do you personally know someone who you believe was fired from a state/public job because of their political beliefs since October 2012? (q83)




After the parliamentary elections of October 2012 has the level of crime in Georgia... (q13)




Generally, taking everything into account, since October 2012 you and your household are... (q9 X Settlement)




What are the main challenges Georgian economy faces? Name up to three (q10)














To what extent do you agree or disagree that the current government is making the changes that matter to you? (q14)




To what extent do you agree or disagree that if the Parliamentary opposition was in charge they would make the changes that matter to you? (q15)




How important is the protection of minority rights to Georgia's democratic development? (q23)








How important is the protection of rights of the following minorities? (q25)






What do you think are the three biggest barriers to free and fair elections in Georgia? (61) Part 1








Whose opinion do you think matters most, when it comes to deciding whether elections have been run well? (q75)




What affect, if any, did these discounts have on your choice to vote? (q77)






Do you approve or disapprove of Bishop Jacob calling upon voters to vote against UNM? (q79)








Do you think the church should be engaging in election campaign? (q82)


Do you approve or disapprove that Prime Minister Bidzina Ivanishvili continues to be a decision-maker in the actions of the government? (q87) - of the 50%




On June 27 Georgia signed an Association agreement with EU. Were you aware? (q89)




Do you approve or disapprove of Georgia signing an Association agreement with EU? (q90)






If you approve of Georgia signing an Association agreement with EU, why? (q91) - of the 69%







Do you approve or disapprove of Court's decision to repeal the suspension of sales of agricultural land to foreigners? (q101)




Do you approve or disapprove of Court's decision to repeal the suspension of sales of agricultural land to foreigners? (q101 X Settlement)




Do you approve or disapprove of Sakrebulo power to remove directly elected Gamgebeli or Mayor by a 2/3 vote? (q103)




Which of the following two statements do you agree with? (q40)




When do you think Georgia will be granted NATO membership? (q39)






What are your main sources of information for receiving news about Georgian politics and current events? (q42/q43)




Do you watch coverage of Georgian politics and current events on the following channels? National (q45)




Do you watch coverage of Georgian politics and current events on the following channels? Regional (q45)




Do you think that news about Georgian politics and current affairs on the following Georgian TV channels mostly reflect the interests of UNM, Georgian Dream or neither? National (q46)





How much do you trust or distrust coverage of news and current affairs on the following TV channels? National (q47)




How much do you trust or distrust coverage of news and current affairs on the following TV channels? Regional (q47)






Where do you talk about politics? (q85) - of the 56% who talk about politics
